

Service design offers the opportunity to look at the challenges that face your organisation from a different perspective – enabling you to really understand what's happening in your services, and how your customers experience them.


This course will equip you with the confidence to apply a service design approach in your organisation. THE PROCESS

Based on the double-diamond model, the fundamentals of this design workshop follow the four key stages: research, define, develop, and refine. This iconic process allows us to identify the systemic problem we're trying to solve, keeping the teams' objectives aligned by following the proper steps and reducing the risks of losing focus on the project goal.

Through the divergent stage of this workshop, you will focus on mapping out your research, understanding the critical pain points that your stakeholders may experience and identifying the golden areas of opportunity to explore. During the Convergent stage of this workshop, you will then begin to refine your concepts and focus your direction towards the right solution.

Prof. Anna Whicher


