






Challenges – limits of design protection

Challenges - new design representation regime

New Designs Directive allows:

- static,
- dynamic
- animated views

+

- drawings
- Photographs
- Videos
- computer imaging

Other rules to determine in the future:

- Size of electronic file: 2 MB for MP4, OBJ, STL and X3D
- Formats: OBJ, STL and X3D (one 3D dynamic views) STEP, IGES, U3D + MP4 + PNG, TIFF,
 GIF, SVG
 - *Trade marks
 - *WIPO recommendations
 - *Currently allowed for RCDs

Registration symbol

The holder of a registered EU design may inform the public that the design is registered by displaying on the product in which the design is incorporated or to which it is applied the letter D enclosed within a circle. Such design notice may be accompanied by the registration number of the design or hyperlinked to the entry of the design in the Register.;'

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Al as a designer under EU design law

(#) Artificial intelligence (AI) and related technologies are based on the creation and execution of computer programs which, as such, are excluded from design protection but may be used in developing products eligible for design protection. In order to unlock the potential of human-centred AI in the Union, designs generated by AI and related technologies should be eligible for design protection provided that an intentional human act regarding the design of the features of the particular appearance of the product was involved and all other requirements for protection are fulfilled. Ownership of such AI-generated design should, in principle, lay with the person who performed such act.

"where a design is computer-generated, the right to the EU design shall vest in the person making a choice of the features of the appearance of the design."








Al to help design counterfeiters
